When you crave premium healthy dry fruits from the farms of Afghanistan, Setara should come to mind. Setara Dry Fruits and Nuts Processing takes pride in being an innovative woman owned and led agribusiness in Afghanistan. Our range of products includes different varieties of dry fruits, nuts and spices, such as apricots, black and white mulberries, raisins, walnuts, almonds, pistachios and saffron. These products are handpicked by the farmers, then processed and packaged in our state of the art processing plant in Badam Bagh of Kabul. Setara's products have been specifically curated for an international market, with a special focus on exporting gourmet Afghan dry fruits and nuts worldwide with all necessary certifications.

CEO MESSAGE

Since 2008, when my husband accepted a job in Afghanistan and returned to Kabul after three decades of living abroad, we have been involved in many business ventures in the country.

While supporting our family, we talked about doing something more meaningful, something that would leave a lasting impact in Afghanistan. So, while my husband continued his work in contracting business for the following five years, we worked to develop our plan to learn and explore ideas for the future.

In 2014, our quest started small with Elham (the name of our son) Markets, a chain of dry fruits and nuts outlets in Kabul which taught us a lot about the dry fruits and nuts business and made us realize that no one had done anything to improve this sector. Packaging was simple plastic bags filled by hands, unsanitary and everyone in the whole industry had the same packaging or sold them loose. They still do this to this today. Elham went from one modest store to five and eventually we open one in Kabul's Mandai Market constantly thinking on how we can improve the dry fruits and nuts business. In 2018 we took our dream a notch higher and established Setara Dry Fruits & Nuts Processing. Setara, Elham's big sister was destined to be a premier purveyor of quality dry fruits and nuts packaged to the international standards and with proper and needed certification, state of the art technology and machinery, trained and mainly female processing staff, and a modern, clean plant.

Today, Setara has earned the respect within the private sector, locally and in the international community, government and chambers of commerce's. Our products are sold in premium Afghan supermarkets and are now being exported globally.

There is a special story about our staff at Badam Bagh who processes our dry fruits and nuts that I want to share. When we started Elham Markets, we used day hire laborers to clean dry fruits for us. We noticed among men we hired, there were women also. So we asked about them and to our dismay and surprise, we found that these women do not have actually a salary when they work. They were given the shells of Almonds and Walnuts when they crack them as their earnings.

They never made money for their hard work. We naturally did not want that so with Setara's processing plant, we hired many of the women who worked in Mandai markets and gave them full time processing jobs, we trained them in all aspect of processing of dry fruits and nuts and we paid them a salary they deserve. As for the shells of Almonds and Walnuts, we give them to our staff during cold seasons so they warm their homes; for free.

The future at Setara seems bright. We intent to provide day care facilities for our

staff, health insurance, literacy training on language and basic computer knowledge and employee stock options once she reaches a level of maturity where we have regular and on-going orders to fulfill. Only then our dreams become reality.







STORY OF SETARA

In year 2014, the Arghandiwals ventured into Afghan dry fruits and nuts market by opening their label, Elham Markets. Elham Markets became a chain of five dryfruits outlets in various location primarily in Kabul and one flagship store in the region's oldest wholesale market; The Kabul Mandawi Market. This startup and chain of stores helped them understand the dry fruit market of Afghanistan. However, soon they realized that Afghanistan produced the most artisanal and exotic dry-fruits but yet it lacks behind in producing premium quality dry fruits such as value added processes like sorting, grading, shelling, and packaging to the international standards.

Setara was created as a premium brand, associated with Afghan dried fruits and nuts. In 2018, Setara was established at Badam Bagh, Kabul, Afghanistan to process,

clean, sort, shell, grade and package Afghan dry fruits and nuts using state-of-theart processing equipment imported from the United States, India and China. The company has an all-women Afghan workforce, who is trained and certified workers. Setara follows international standards in plant to make sure cleanliness and quality of our products is always retained. Setara is a bridge between farmers and international market. At Setara, the harvest is collected from the farmers and brought to the plant, where it is processed and packaged further to the premium

quality of dry-fruits.

Our products are ISO2200-2005 certified and have been exported to countries including India, Canada and Europe. Our products have been curated specifically for international market, which comes in various packaging like Zip-lock, Pillow Bags, and Gift-Packs and sold in bulk. The core business includes the processing of different varieties of the following items such as Apricots, Walnuts, and Black and White Mulberries, different types of Raisins, Almonds, Pistachios and Saffron.

WHAT WE DO?

We believe in providing our customers a premium, gourmet Afghan dried fruits and nuts. Our products are harvested at its finest quality from the farmers around the Afghanistan. Once, the harvest is brought to plant, it is processed in the ISO2200-2005 certified plant in Badam Bagh, Kabul.

Setara is a women-owned and led team, where all the processing workers are ladies, who are trained workers and are the major threshold to run the plant. Setara empowers these women, and helps them grow into better version of themselves, both professionally and personally. The work culture is productive and friendly, where everyone feels at home.

Once product is sorted and processed, it is packed in pillow bags, Zip-lock bags, and in bulk boxes, ready to be exported to international markets.

Our aim has always been to improve Afghanistan's dry fruits & nuts processing by helping farmers produce better crop, and then clean, sort, grade, package, and offer its products to both the Afghanistan's markets and also the international markets a series of valuable products ready for the shelves of supermarkets.

We do this by employing state of the art processing machinery, trained staff, certified processes in a clean, and certified, professionally built processing plant in Badam Bagh Kabul Afghanistan.

We are a mainly women owned business and our team in Kabul is consists of mainly female processing plant workers. Our team in Afghanistan has built solid relationships and has signed contracts and MoU with dozens of farmers and farmers' associations to make sure we have sufficient inventory to satisfy our customers' demand for fine quality Afghan Dry Fruits & Nuts.

Our core business includes professionally drying fruits, carefully picked Almonds, Raisins, Walnuts, Apricots, Mulberries and Pistachios to mention a few, clean, sort/grade, and finally package them professionally using Zip Lock and Pillow packaging type and processing.

The saffron is harvested-by hand and grows in Herat, Afghanistan. It is harvested in the mid-morning, when the flowers are still closed in order to protect the delicate stigmas inside. It takes about 1,000 flowers to produce just one ounce of saffron.
